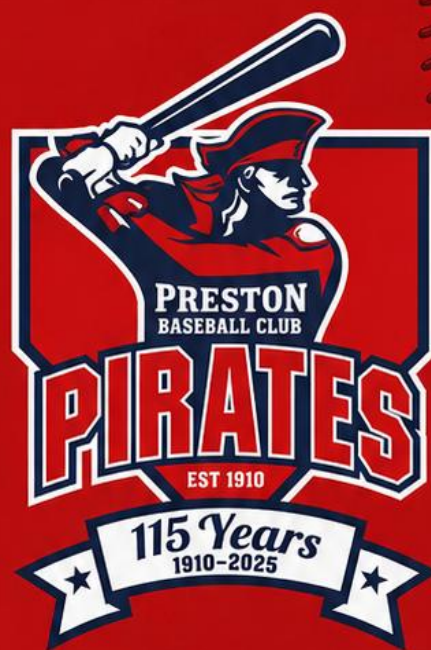

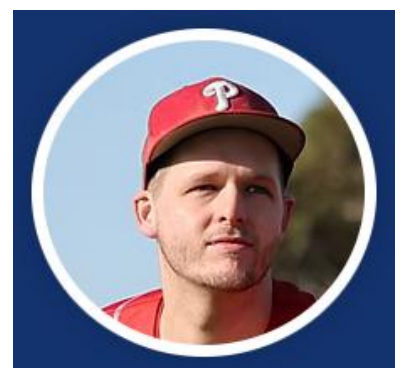

President's Report

Celebrating 115 Years

The 2025/2026 Summer Baseball Season marked a significant milestone for the Preston Pirates Baseball Club, celebrating 115 years since its foundation in 1910.

Established by members of the Preston Cricket Club, in 1910 the Club entered the Victorian Baseball League in B Grade, with its first recorded team taking the field and laying the foundations for organised baseball in Preston.

In the early years, baseball was played as a winter sport, often preceding Victorian Football Association matches on shared sporting grounds. In the early years Preston's home games were played at what is now Preston City Oval, located near to the Preston City Council Chambers on High Street.

It would be another 74 years before the Club secured its first A Grade (Division 1) Premiership in 1984.

As we celebrate 115 years of history, we acknowledge the generations of players, volunteers, officials, members and supporters who have contributed to the Club's legacy. Through both challenging and prosperous times, their dedication and commitment have provided today's players and families with the opportunity to be part of the Preston Pirates Baseball Club community.

We recognise that we are merely custodians of this proud Club. On and off the field, we have a responsibility to honour the efforts of those who came before us and to leave the Preston Pirates Baseball Club in an even stronger position for future generations.



Club Community Contributions

During the year, members of the Preston Pirates community made significant contributions that supported the ongoing improvement of the facilities available for everyone to enjoy.

A Place to Relax and Connect

To help make our clubrooms more welcoming and comfortable, we extend our sincere thanks to Marianne Foreman for donating a new couch. This generous contribution has provided members and visitors with a comfortable place to relax and socialise while enjoying time at the Club.



Preserving Our History

With 115 years of history to catalogue, preserve and protect, a project that has been quietly progressing in the background which has focused on consolidating and documenting the rich history of the Preston Pirates Baseball Club.

The clubrooms did not have a suitable display cabinet to showcase these treasured items.



Thanks to the generosity of Preston and Natasha Biddick of Biddick's Bakery, who have been a major partner of the Club over the past two seasons, the Club was able to purchase a display cabinet to house and exhibit a selection of our historical memorabilia. The display cabinet now provides members and visitors with an opportunity to connect with the Club's proud history and recognise the contributions of those who have helped shape the Preston Pirates over the past 115 years.

Enhancing the Canteen Experience

The addition of a slushy machine had previously been identified as an improvement to the items offered in the Canteen and grow Canteen revenue. Thanks to the generosity of Karolina Caporetto of KC Loans, the Club was able to purchase a new slushy machine just in time for the Australian Youth Championship held in January.

Since its arrival, members and visitors have enthusiastically embraced the new addition, with a wide range of flavours being taste-tested throughout the season enhancing the game-day experience for players, families and supporters alike.

The Preston Pirates Baseball Club is fortunate to have a community that continually gives back, helping to create a positive and enjoyable environment for current and future generations of players, families, volunteers and supporters. Thank you Marianne, Preston & Natasha and Karolina.



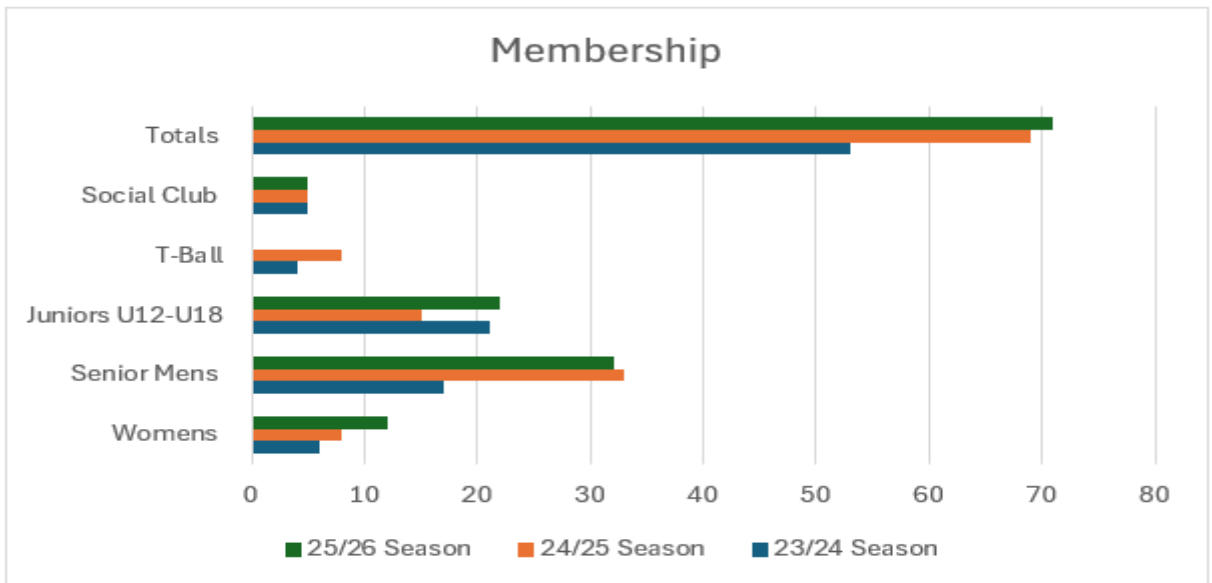
Membership

Overall Club membership increased by two players during the season, including the addition of four players registered with Preston as part of the combined Preston, Doncaster and North Coburg senior women's team. The third senior men's team introduced in the previous season was retained, despite an overall reduction of one senior player.

The Club experienced strong growth in its junior program, with an increase of seven junior players. This enabled Preston to field standalone Under 12 and Under 14 teams without the need to combine with other clubs, while the Under 16 players continued to participate in a combined team arrangement.

The most significant decline occurred in the T-Ball program, with a reduction of eight players. This followed the Board's difficult decision to suspend the T-Ball program for the season due to low registration numbers. Re-establishing a vibrant and sustainable T-Ball program will be a key focus for the coming season.

Financial

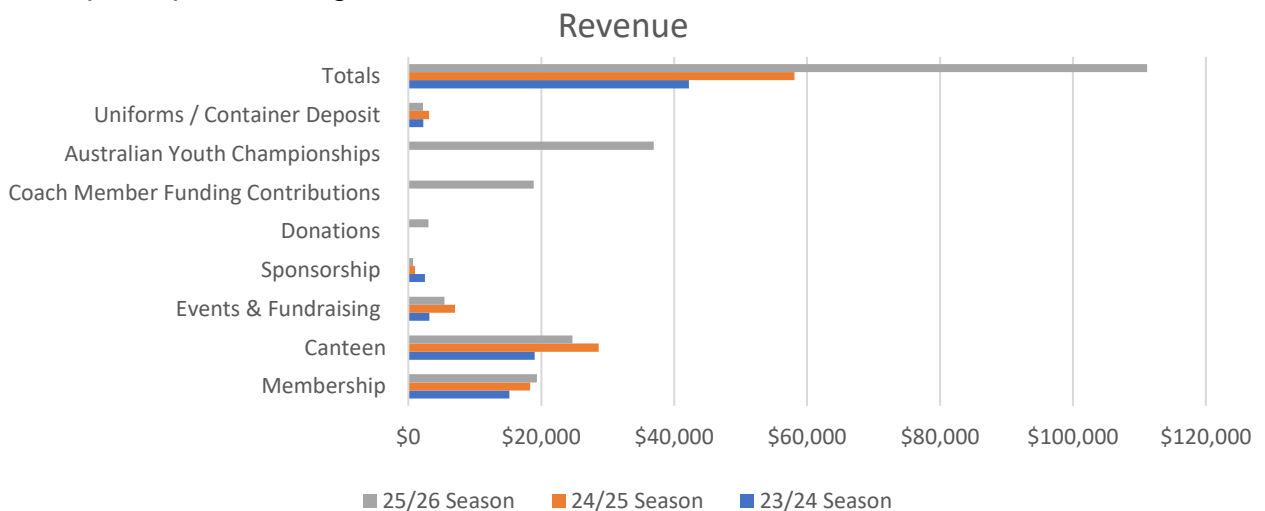
Revenue from membership fees increased slightly during the season, reflecting the mix of players registered and the modest growth in overall membership. Importantly, the Board has not increased Club membership fees since the current fee structure was introduced in the 2021/22 season. This excludes annual affiliation fees levied by Baseball Victoria and Baseball Australia.

Canteen revenue declined during the season due to several factors. (Excluding revenue from the Australian Youth Championships) The Club did not host the Baseball Victoria Development Program on Friday evenings following the Christmas break, and three weekends of home games were lost due to ground closures due to issues with the club room toilets and adverse weather conditions. Collectively, these factors contributed to a reduction in canteen revenue of \$3,924 compared to the previous season.

A very small number of members of the Pirates community contributed a remarkable \$18,865 to help cover the cost of enhanced and expended coaching throughout the season. Without their extraordinary generosity, the Club would not have been able to make this significant investment in coaching and player development.

It was this collective commitment to supporting the Club and its players that made these coaching improvements possible. Your contribution has helped strengthen our baseball program and create a better experience for all participants throughout the season.



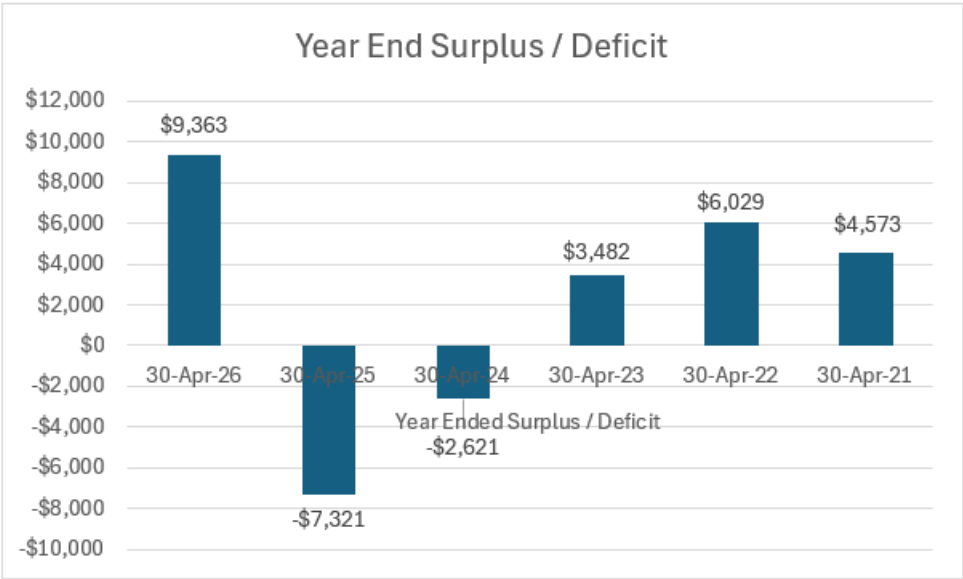
With the additional income from the Australian Youth Championships of \$36,922 predominantly via Canteen sales, **overall income increased from \$58,113 in 2024/25 to \$111,192 in 2025/26, an increase of \$53,079 or 91.3%.** This significant growth reflects the Club's success in expanding its revenue streams and strengthening its financial position during the year.

Expenses increased from \$65,434 in 2024/25 to \$101,830 in 2025/26, an increase of \$36,396 or 55.6%. The increase in expenditure reflects the Club's investment in coaching, player development, baseball operations, and the delivery of the Australian Youth Championships.

The Club posted a surplus of \$9,362 in 2025/26, representing a turnaround of \$16,684 compared to the previous financial year. This follows deficits in both 2023/24 and 2024/25 and represents the Club's largest surplus since the COVID-19 pandemic and since relocating to Ganbu Djila Sports Park.

The result reflects the success of the Club's efforts to grow revenue, control costs, deliver major events, and invest strategically in coaching, player development, and facilities while maintaining a strong financial position.

On Field

The Club welcomed **Troy Justice** as the first import coach and player recruited by Preston Pirates since before the COVID-19 pandemic. The ability for the Club to recruit and fund an import coach/player has only been possible due to the hard work of the Board over recent years in strengthening the Club's financial position and rebuilding playing numbers to support this commitment.

During the first part of the season, the Club also welcomed back Ben Utting, who provided specialist skills coaching to support the new training program introduced by Troy. Together, their contribution helped lift the standard of coaching and player development across the senior program.



The **Premier League 2 Firsts team** finished the season with 9 wins and 16 losses, representing a significant improvement on the previous season. In what was a highly competitive competition, aside from the top two teams, only four wins separated third and seventh place, with Preston finishing seventh out of eight teams. Several of the Club's losses were closely contested, and with improved pitching depth through recruitment and player development, the gap between wins and losses can be significantly narrowed in future seasons.

The **Premier League 2 Reserves team** finished with 4 wins and 14 losses, also an improvement on the previous season. As with the Firsts, a number of games were closely contested. Throughout the season, the Club faced challenges in consistently fielding both Premier League teams, with several players regularly backing up and playing in both matches on the same day.

The **Sunday Regional North West team** finished with 1 win and 17 losses. While the results did not reflect the effort and commitment of the playing group, there were many encouraging signs of development throughout the season, with players continuing to improve their skills and experience at senior level baseball.

Congratulations to **William Jackson** who was awarded the **Regional North West League Most Valuable Player** by Baseball Victoria.

The **Women's Regional North West team** followed up its Premiership success from the previous season by going **back-to-back**, winning the Women's Regional North West Premiership for a second consecutive year.

This outstanding achievement further strengthened the team's place in the Club's history after securing the Club's first Women's Premiership just twelve months earlier.



The Women's Program is central to the Club's overall baseball program and is fully integrated into all aspects of the Club's operations, culture and activities. The continued growth and success of the program remains a key strategic priority for Preston Pirates.

In recognition of this integration, the Board resolved to amend the eligibility criteria for the Westcott Memorial Trophy Club Champion award first presented in 1943 to ensure that players from both the senior men's and women's programs could be equally considered for the Club's highest individual honour.

As a result, for the first time in the Club's history, in the 25/26 season a player from the Women's team was awarded the Westcott Memorial Trophy, with Stephanie Scane named Club Champion following an extraordinary season in which she recorded a batting average above .800.

Stephaine Scane's achievements were further recognised when she was awarded the **Most Valuable Player Award for the Women's Regional North West League** by Baseball Victoria.

The Club's partnership with Doncaster Baseball Club and North Coburg Baseball Club continues to play an important role in the success of the Women's Program, with players from both clubs contributing strongly throughout the season. The partnership remains an excellent example of clubs working together to create greater playing opportunities and strengthen women's baseball.



Thanks to improved player retention and the successful recruitment of new players, the Club was able to field standalone Preston Pirates teams in both the U12 and U14 competitions for the first time in many years. The small number of U16 players either progressed into senior baseball or participated in a combined team arrangement with Fitzroy Baseball Club, providing important development opportunities at the next level.

The **U12 Little League Major West team** finished the season with 5 wins and 7 losses, demonstrating significant improvement throughout the year and showcasing the benefits of the Club's growing junior development program.



The **U14 Senior League 70 West team** finished the season with 1 win and 12 losses. While results were challenging, the players continued to develop their skills, confidence and understanding of the game throughout the season, with many showing substantial improvement from the first game to the last.

For both teams, growth was evident not only in results but also in the development of individual skills, baseball knowledge, teamwork and confidence. The season provided a strong foundation for future success and highlighted the positive impact of the Club's continued investment in junior player development. The ability to field standalone U12 and U14 teams is an important milestone for the Club and a positive sign for the long-term sustainability of the junior program.



Off Field

Post Training Meals

During the season, thanks to the efforts of a small group of dedicated volunteers, post-training meals were provided for junior and senior players on Thursday nights leading up to the Christmas break. Following Christmas, these meals were offered less frequently due to the introduction of Thursday night Firsts games.

Events

The annual **Trivia Night** is the Preston Pirates Baseball Club's major fundraising event and an important social occasion on the club calendar.

The 2025/26 Trivia Night was held in late November, following a busy day at Ganbu Djila Sports Park which featured home games for both the Women's and Firsts and Seconds teams. The event embraced an "80's Bogan" theme, with members, families, supporters and friends dressing up and fully embracing the spirit of the night.



The Preston Pirates Baseball Club hosted its annual **Christmas Party** on the final Saturday of home games prior to the Christmas and New Year break.

The event brought together players, families, coaches, volunteers and supporters from across the club to celebrate the first half of the season and enjoy the festive atmosphere. The Christmas Party continues to be an important opportunity to strengthen the club's community spirit and recognise the contribution of members both on and off the field.



Early in the new year, the club welcomed back past players and Life Members for the annual **Past Players and Life Members Day**. The event provided an opportunity to reconnect with former players and administrators, celebrate the rich history of the Preston Pirates Baseball Club, and acknowledge the many individuals who have contributed to the club's success over its 115-year history.



The season concluded with the annual **Season Awards** function which this year combined all teams.

Sponsors and Partners

A special thank you is also extended to **La Trobe Sport**, the club's landlord, and **Charles La Trobe College**, on whose land Ganbu Djila Sports Park is located. Both organisations have been tremendous supporters of the Preston Pirates Baseball Club and have worked collaboratively with the club throughout the season.



2026/2027 Season Planning

The Board has been meeting regularly since the conclusion of the 2025/2026 season and has been actively planning for the Club's 116th season.

Key areas of focus have included the early appointment of coaches across the Club, the relaunch of a T-Ball program, planning and preparation for hosting the Australian Youth Championships, and the implementation of changes to the Club's governance structure. These governance changes are designed to provide greater opportunities for a broader group of members from across the Club community to become involved in the administration and operation of the Club, while also ensuring valuable knowledge, experience and expertise are retained and shared for the benefit of future generations of Pirates members.

Senior Coach Appointed

A key appointment for the Club's 116th season has been the early appointment of Avery Moxey as Player Coach of the Preston Pirates Firsts for the 2026/27 Summer Season. Avery brings extensive international playing and coaching experience, having represented the Bahamas, competed in collegiate baseball in North America, and played senior baseball in Canada. Since joining the Pirates during the 2025/26 season, Avery has made a significant impact both on and off the field, earning appointment as co-captain and finishing the season with the highest batting average in the Firsts team. In addition to leading the senior program, Avery will play an important role in player development across the Club, including supporting the relaunch of the Preston Pirates T-Ball Program



Australian Youth Championships

Following the success of co-hosting the 2026 U16 and U18 Baseball Australia Australian Youth Championships, the Club has been offered the opportunity to co-host the event for the next three years. After carefully assessing the impact on volunteers, the opportunity to showcase the Club and its facilities, and the potential to increase the financial return from hosting the event, the Board accepted the offer. Planning is already underway to further enhance the experience for players, officials, families and spectators, despite the overwhelmingly positive feedback received from all those who attended the Championships in 2026.

T-Ball

During the 2025/26 season, the Board reluctantly resolved to suspend the Club's T-Ball program due to low participant numbers. Following a comprehensive review of the program's strengths and weaknesses over recent seasons, the Board has committed to relaunching T-Ball in 2026/27 with a significantly revised approach. The program will move from weeknight sessions to Saturday mornings from 9:30am to 10:30am and will follow the Little League International 10-week T-Ball curriculum, supported by Baseball Victoria's promotional activities and reduced pricing initiatives to help attract new participants. The revised structure will allow the Club to deliver two 10-week programs during the season: Program 1 from Saturday 17 October to Saturday 19 December 2026 and Program 2 from Saturday 30 January to Saturday 3 April 2027.



The program will be led by a core group of three coaches, currently being finalised, with the aim of additional support from members of the Women's team when playing home games immediately following T-Ball. The Club will undertake a significant promotional campaign and has identified T-Ball as a key player recruitment and retention initiative, recognising its importance in building the long-term sustainability and success of the Preston Pirates Baseball Club.

Second Women's Team Being Explored

Given the recent success of the Club's Women's program, including back-to-back premierships, the Club is exploring the opportunity to introduce a second Women's team competing in a higher division. The Women's program has developed a strong reputation as a fun, inclusive and rewarding environment that supports players of all abilities, and the addition of a second team would provide further development pathways while supporting the continued growth of women's baseball at Preston.

New Club Committees Launched

As part of strengthening the Club's governance and creating greater opportunities for member involvement, the Board has recently introduced four new committees. The PPBC Finance, Commercial & Risk Committee, PPBC Baseball Operations Committee, PPBC Canteen Operations Committee and PPBC Ethics & Integrity Committee. These committees enable members of the Preston Pirates community to contribute their skills, experience and knowledge to the future direction and operation of the Club without the commitment of joining the Board, while also broadening participation, enhancing decision-making and supporting the long-term sustainability of the Pirates.

Volunteers

Finally, and most importantly, I take this opportunity to thank everyone across the club who has volunteered their time, skills, energy and experience to power the Preston Pirates Baseball Club throughout the 2025/26 season. Without this dedicated group of people, we simply would not have a club.

Volunteers are the backbone of community sport. Whether coaching, scoring, umpiring, working in the canteen, assisting with events, fundraising, administration, ground maintenance, or supporting our players and families, every contribution helps make the Preston Pirates a successful and welcoming club.

In particular, I would like to thank the members of the Board who have undertaken a significant amount of work behind the scenes both prior to and throughout the season. Thank you to **Nicole Lynch, Kirsty Fairservice, Michael O'Brien, Brian Sinfield, Marianne Foreman, Mitch Kelly and Brooke Denman** for your commitment, leadership and service to the club.

A special thank you to **Nicole Lynch** and **Mitch Kelly**, who are retiring from the Board at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. Both have made valuable contributions to the club over many years, and on behalf of all members, I thank them for their dedication and service.

To our coaches, thank you for the countless hours spent planning, teaching, mentoring and developing our players. In particular, thank you to **Troy Justice (Seniors and Juniors), Kirsty Fairservice (Women's and Juniors), Brendan Cox, Brian Sinfield and Yoshi Hanami**. Your commitment has helped create a positive and supportive environment for players of all ages and abilities.



Thank you also to **Avery Moxey** and **Jake Paris** for their leadership as Co-Captains of the First's team throughout the season.

A game of baseball is not possible without scorers and umpires. Their contribution is often unseen but is critical to the successful operation of every game. Thank you to our regular senior scorers **Claire Schmierer, Paula Sutherland, Simon Foster and Brian Sinfield** for the many hours you have dedicated throughout the season.

The canteen remains a significant source of the club's annual revenue and an important part of the overall club experience for players, families, supporters and visiting teams. Beyond its financial contribution, the canteen serves as a central gathering place where members and visitors can connect, relax and enjoy the community atmosphere that makes the Preston Pirates Baseball Club special.

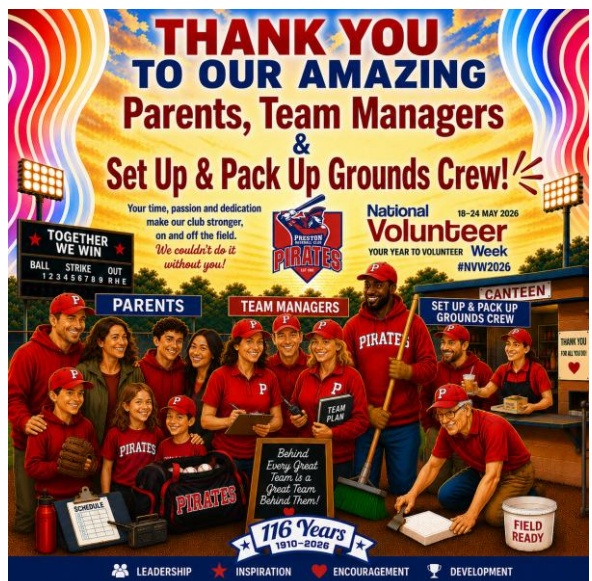

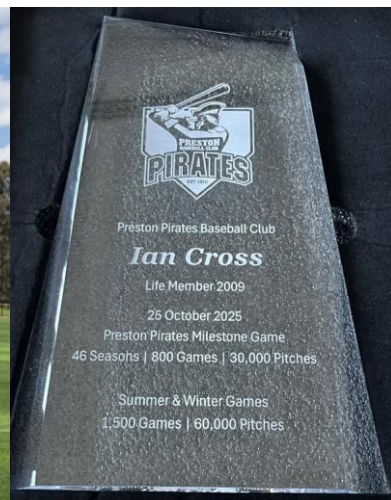

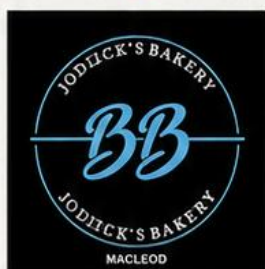
