Working With Children Check

Working with Children Check

You must have a valid Working with Children Check if you have direct contact with or supervise Children under the age of 18 years. This includes roles such as:

- Board / Committee Members
- Coaches / Team Managers
- Scorers / Umpires

Other members of the club who are involved in regular contact with children that are not directly supervised by a person who has a valid WWCC.

Where junior players are playing in a senior team, the minimum requirements for the coach and team manager to have a valid WWCC/

Ganbu Djlia Sports Park

Located at Charles La Trobe College, Ganbu Djila is a multipurpose synthetic field and is the new home of Preston Pirates Baseball Club in Summer for the Victorian Summer Baseball League season and the La Trobe University Baseball Club in Winter for the Melbourne Winter Baseball League season.

Ganbu Djila' stems from the Woiwurrung language, meaning 'one play'.

As an all-synthetic field **metal cleats must not be worn on any** part of the field or batting cages at any time (including training and game time).

Only Mounded Rubber Cleats may be worn. Runners are also permissible during training.
